
This is a game of chance. There are four Hebrew letters on a dreidel, a NUN (1), a GIMMEL (1), a HEY (π), and a SHIN (ϖ). These letters stand for "**Nes Gadol Haya Sham**" ("A great miracle happened here"). Using candy or nuts or whatever, every player starts with an equal amount. The Dreidel is spun and how it lands determines what you do with your objects and the pile. Here are the rules: NUN (1)- Do Nothing, GIMMEL (1) - Take all of the objects, HEY (π) - Take half of the objects, SHIN (ϖ) - Put in to the pile of objects

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
